Our Vessels

Rocio del Mar and Quino del Mar are of the utmost seaworthiness and approved by the US and Mexican Coast Guards. They are equipped with state-of-the-art electronics and all required safety equipment.

Rocio del Mar

Rocio del Mar is 110' long with a 25' beam.

Rocio Del Mar accommodates 20 guests in ten air-conditioned cabins, each sleeping two guests. There are six cabins with two oversized twin bunks (cabins 1-6), two cabins with a full bed and a twin bunk (cabins 9 & 10 on the upper deck), and two cabins with a queen bed each (cabins 7 & 8).

Each cabin has four drawers for storage and clothing/towel hooks. It also has a bathroom with a lavatory, shower, and toilet. We provide shampoo, soap, and bath wash. There are no hair dryers.

Our guests enjoy comfortable mattresses and quality bed linens. Our steward cleans all rooms, bunks, and bathrooms during the first dives of the day. We provide bath towels and dive deck towels, which are changed mid-trip.

The galley is in the boat's bow and comfortably accommodates all 20 passengers. The galley also has a television and DVD player should the group want to do presentations.

We have a large salon on the upper deck with full-sized sofas, a TV, and a computer station.


There is an outside covered deck with comfortable patio furniture and a shaded sundeck with lawn chairs perfect for relaxing between dives.

There are two outdoor showers and a restroom next to the dive deck.


All voltage is 110, just like in the USA. Each bunk has a double outlet.







Our Destinations in Mexico



Archipiélago de Revillagigedo / Socorro Island

November - May 10 days / 9 nights / 6 days of diving

Have you ever felt the immensity of the ocean, the sense of being a small part of something truly grand? That's the feeling that washes over you in the Revillagigedo Islands. Rising from the deep Pacific, these volcanic peaks are a sanctuary for marine life found nowhere else on Earth.

A UNESCO World Heritage Site, the Revillagigedo Archipelago, located 250 miles off the southern coast of Baja California, Mexico, blurs the boundaries between the observer and the observed. Socorro Island, a jewel in the archipelago's crown, is a testament to the power and beauty of the natural world. Here, you're not just watching nature; you are immersed in it.

Imagine drifting through the clear waters, surrounded by a kaleidoscope of life. Schools of hammerhead sharks glide effortlessly by, their distinctive silhouettes a testament to the unique biodiversity of these islands. Giant schools of jacks, barracuda, tuna, and wahoo shimmer and swirl around you, a dazzling display of the ocean's abundance. And the sharks! You can encounter Galapagos, silky, whitetip reef, silvertip, and blacktip sharks, each playing a vital role in the oceanic ecosystem. A sleek tiger shark might materialize from the blue, its distinctive stripes a flash of wild beauty. Playful dolphins, curious and intelligent, often approach divers, eager to interact. And then there are the mantas – the stars of the show. With their enormous wings, these majestic creatures perform an underwater ballet, gliding and swirling with effortless grace. They circle and dance, seemingly welcoming you to their world.

Other animal encounters include humpback whales from mid-February to mid-April. During this time, the haunting songs of males fill the water, a symphony of the deep. Surface sightings are common. Whale sharks can be seen in November, December, and May. The dramatic display of bait balls and false orcas can add to the May magic.

A trip to Revillagigedo is more than just a dive; it's a pilgrimage to where the ocean's wonders unfold before you.

Mid-September - October 13 days / 12 nights / 11 days of diving

This isn't just a dive trip; it's an immersion into a realm of unparalleled marine biodiversity, an adventure that will resonate with you long after you've returned to dry land.

This is a true expedition, a 700-mile journey from one end of this wondrous sea to the other. Imagine yourself descending into the nutrient-rich waters, where pristine walls explode with color. See the regal king angelfish, the endemic Cortez angelfish, dozens of triggerfish, and the schools of other fish as they shimmer and swirl, a kaleidoscope of marine diversity. The waters become more tropical in the south, and the colorful fish are even more abundant. Divers will explore the ghostly remains of two shipwrecks, now vibrant artificial reefs teeming with life. We've even planned a special night dive, where powerful lights attract swarms of mobula rays, creating an unforgettable spectacle. We'll also dive with sea lions at remarkable sites like Los Islotes, and if we are lucky, we can witness the awe-inspiring sight of schooling hammerhead sharks. The remote islands offer opportunities for hikes between surface intervals, with spectacular views of the rugged coastline. At night, the absence of light pollution reveals a sky ablaze with stars, so close you feel you could reach out and touch them.

After the second dive, guests will be served a hot homemade soup followed by a hot plated lunch. We serve a large snack in the afternoon, often sandwiches, ceviche, fruit, cheeses, and more. For dinner, guests enjoy a three-course, plated meal with a salad, entrée, and homemade dessert. Hot and cold beverages are always available, including canned soft drinks.

Divers also enjoy complimentary beer and wine after their last dive of the day.

Our chefs can accommodate most special dietary needs, including gluten-free and vegan, with a wonderful variety of delicious options.

Our Crew

The only thing better than the food aboard Rocio del Mar and Quino del Mar is THE CREW! Our captain, steward, panga drivers, divemasters, and engineer work together as a team to ensure your comfort and safety, so you come away feeling like you have a new family in Mexico.

Please let your crew know if there's anything you want or need at any time during your trip. No request is too big, and no job is too small.











Diving

We require all divers to be open-water certified.

We strongly advise a minimum of 50 logged dives for Revillagigedo, as the diving can be challenging. Good buoyancy skills are crucial.

Our dive platforms are meticulously arranged, with each diver assigned a designated dive station.

On board, a well-equipped camera table, with numerous power outlets and access to compressed air is available. We have fire-retardant Lipo bags for charging lithium batteries.

We furnish 80 cubic ft. aluminum tanks compatible with both DIN and yoke connections, along with weights and belts for divers' convenience.

Our diving operations utilize two 18-foot Achilles inflatable pangas, each accompanied by a vigilant driver who constantly monitors for emerging bubbles. The transfer from the boat to the dive site is typically brief, facilitated by sturdy and user-friendly ladders on the pangas.





Passengers are organized into three groups, each led by a diverset for the dive excursions. Upon receiving a detailed dive briefing, each group gears up, embarks on the panga, and enters the water with a backroll entry. Our attentive crew is available to assist divers with any physical limitations they may have. Group dives are conducted, and at the conclusion of the dive, the panga will approach each diver. Weight belts and BCDs are removed and lifted into the boat by the driver, and divers then remove their fins before boarding the vessel. Upon returning to the main boat, the crew will stow the gear and can hand back any cameras to the divers.

Given the demanding nature of diving, participants must maintain good physical health, engage in regular diving activities, and have recent diving experience. Our divemasters and instructors serve as guides solely and are not responsible for providing diving instruction or supervising guests lacking fundamental buoyancy skills. It is imperative that each diver comprehends their own diving proficiencies and limitations.

For those requiring more personalized attention during their diving ventures, booking a private diversater is recommended at a rate of \$750. To secure a private diversater, please coordinate this arrangement at least 30 days before your scheduled trip by emailing us at info@MexicoLiveaboards.com.

Nitrox Certification

We highly recommend divers dive nitrox in Revillagigedo as it will help maximize bottom time.

For guests who are not nitrox-certified, we offer nitrox classes and certification through PADI on most of our trips. The price is \$200 per person. You will be able to dive nitrox throughout your trip. The price for nitrox is \$140 per person.

If you have private health insurance coverage for dive accidents/evacuation, provide only the page that states coverage for a scuba diving accident (including evacuation) and the declaration page showing you are the owner of the policy and policy number.

You will be at sea, and though it can often be calm, please be prepared for rough seas. Several over-the-counter remedies can help you. If you have a propensity to motion sickness or are concerned that you might develop symptoms, please prepare yourself with preventive measures before departure. Please consult your physician about what will work best for you.

Marijuana and all drugs are illegal in Mexico. Do not bring these on board.

Unforeseen Events / Trip Insurance / Trip Interruption

Rocio del Mar and Quino del Mar is of the utmost seaworthiness and approved by the US Coast Guard and the Mexican Coast Guard. She is equipped with state-of-the-art electronics and all necessary safety equipment.

Passenger safety is paramount; therefore, the captain has the sole discretion to change, delay, return early, or cancel the cruise if necessary. These reasons include, but are not limited to, adverse weather conditions, perils of the sea, acts of God, political disturbances, or force majeure.

We highly suggest trip insurance as it can reimburse you for unused, non-refundable, prepaid trip costs if you are prevented from taking your trip due to a covered reason. Not all trip insurance is the same, so it's essential to ensure that you purchase travel insurance that includes travel interruption coverage.
