

Socorro Park Fees

Effective January 1, 2025



SUBJECT TO CHANGE WITHOUT NOTICE

Park fees are set by Comisión Nacional de Áreas Naturales Protegidas (CONANP).

The park fee for Parque Nacional Revillagigedo is 3,688 pesos per day of diving or 21,732 pesos for a six-day trip. At an exchange rate of 19, this is \$1144.

Retirees, academics, and Mexican Nationals may qualify for an exemption.

PARK FEE EXEMPTIONS

RETIRED PERSONS - 100% discount

The park fee is waived for people who provide official documentation that they are retired or pensioned. The document must include "RETIRED" or "PENSIONED."

US citizens receiving retirement benefits from the Social Security Administration can download a Benefit Verification Letter from the www.SSA.gov website.

Mexican nationals and residents 60+ years of age with an INAPAM card.

ACADEMIC DISCOUNT FOR ACTIVE TEACHERS AND STUDENTS - 75% discount

Active students and teachers receive a 75% discount. A photocopy of an identification card with a photo and the current date is required.

MEXICAN NATIONALS AND RESIDENTS - 50% discount

Mexican nationals and residents with INE credentials or permanent/temporary residence cards receive a 50% discount.

- Park fee exception documentation must be in ENGLISH OR SPANISH (if it is another language, it must accompany a translation.)
- It's important to be prepared. If you're requesting an exemption, please email the required documents to Documents@MexicoLiveboards.com one month before your trip. This will ensure that your exemption is processed in time.
- While we strive to approve all exemptions, please know that you'll be responsible for the park fee if CONANP does not approve your documents. We want to ensure you're fully informed and prepared for your trip.

PARK FEE PAYMENTS

Please email Carmina@MexicoLiveboards.com to pay your park fees at least two weeks before departure. This will allow us to process your payment and ensure a smooth check-in process. We accept payment by credit card or cash in USD, EUR, or MXN and do not charge a credit card service fee. Guests can also pay for this on the boat.
